s British Science Week enters its fourth decade, it's a great time to think about how the world is changing and how we can adapt to those changes.

You can also think about all the types of change and adaptation we see in STEM – the options are endless!

Poster Competition

The theme for 2025 is 'Change and adapt and there are many STEM topics that can be explored.

We are asking children to create a poster based on this year's theme.

Ideas could involve: showing how plants and animals adapt to changing seasons or surroundings, or how humans have adapted to changing technology.

You could look at climate change and how we can adapt our behaviours to protect the environment or

your favourite science experiment and how it shows change. The more creative the interpretation of the theme, the better!

How will the posters be judged?

We wish that everyone could be a winner, but we only have a limited number of prizes. So, here's the lowdown on what the judges will be looking for:

- Creativity in approach Innovative angle on the content or creative interpretation of the theme –
 don't be afraid to think outside the box
- Content Clear, accurate and informative about a STEM topic
- Effective communication presented and communicated in an engaging way

Members of the British Science Association will shortlist entries, and a panel of judges will select a winner in each category. The two runners up in each category will be uploaded to our Facebook page and the public will decide on a 'popular vote' winner.

Once completed, children should bring their posters into school so we can photograph and send into the competition via email. Closing date for entries to be brought into school is Friday 14th March. We will look forward to sharing our entries with you on our website.
